

„BRAUCHEN“ IN ENGLISH

NEED - NEEDN'T

need = brauchen

needn't = nicht brauchen, nicht müssen

Example: I **need** your help. (= I can't do it myself, you have to help me.)

You **needn't** help me. I can manage alone.

1. I a new dishwasher. Mine broke down yesterday.
2. Paul new clothes, he is taller now.
3. You go, you can stay a little longer.
4. You shout, I can hear you.
5. Let me know if you anything!
6. You take a taxi. I can give you a lift.
7. Tom a new CD player.
8. You tell me your secret if you don't want to.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE ...? - IT TAKES ... (man braucht)

PRESENT TENSE	
ich brauche	It takes me half an hour to tidy up my room.
du brauchst	It takes you half an hour to tidy up your room.
er braucht	It takes him half an hour to tidy up his room.
sie braucht	It takes her half an hour to tidy up her room.
wir brauchen	It takes us half an hour to tidy up our room.
ihr braucht	It takes you half an hour to tidy up your room.
sie brauchen	It takes them half an hour to tidy up their room.

PAST TENSE: It took me ...

How long does it take you to do these things?

1. get to school
2. do your homework
3. read a book
4. write a text message
5. load the dishwasher
6. go from Steyr to Linz

7. Tom **needs** a new CD player.
8. You **needn't** tell me your secret if you don't want to.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE ...? - IT TAKES ... (man braucht)

PRESENT TENSE	
ich brauche	It takes me half an hour to tidy up my room.
du brauchst	It takes you half an hour to tidy up your room.
er braucht	It takes him half an hour to tidy up his room.
sie braucht	It takes her half an hour to tidy up her room.
wir brauchen	It takes us half an hour to tidy up our room.
ihr braucht	It takes you half an hour to tidy up your room.
sie brauchen	It takes them half an hour to tidy up their room.

PAST TENSE: It took me ...

How long does it take you to do these things?

1. get to school: **It takes me half an hour to get to school.**
2. do your homework: **It takes me twenty minutes to do my homework.**
3. read a book: **It takes me two weeks to read a book.**
4. write a text message: **It takes me ten seconds to write a text message.**
5. load the dishwasher: **It takes me five minutes to load the dishwasher.**
6. go from Steyr to Linz: **It takes me an hour to go from Steyr to Linz.**
